Worldwide epidemiological situation

- The epidemic is still spreading in all continents: to date, more than 95 000 cases have been reported.
- Since June 29, 2009, new countries have reported their first cases: **Aruba, Cook Islands, Guam, Libya, Monaco, Nauru, Nepal, Palau, Saint Lucia, Samoa (US), and Uganda**. Among EpiSouth countries: **Bosnia, FYRO Macedonia, Malta, and Syria**.

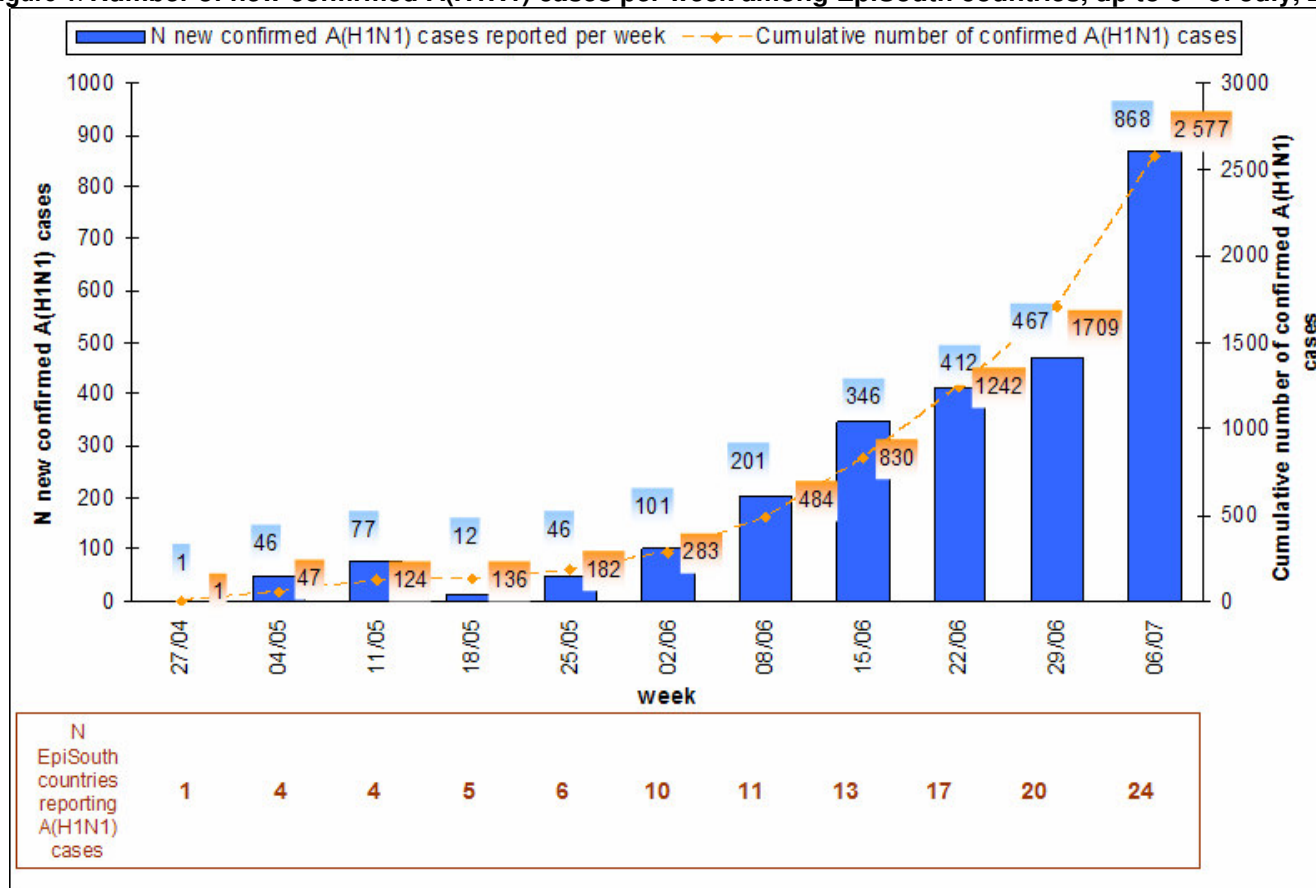
France

- To date, **371 confirmed cases** were reported, including 4 in French Polynesia, 29 in New Caledonia, 7 in French departments of America and 1 in La Réunion Island:
 - 341 were imported cases or secondary cases linked to imported cases.
 - 30 cases (with no travel history) are secondary cases not linked to imported cases.
- 12 clusters are linked to cases with travel history.
- 6 clusters are not linked to cases with travel history.
- 292 suspected cases are under investigation.

EpiSouth countries

- On July 6, 2009, **2 577 confirmed A(H1N1) cases** and **1 death** have been reported among EpiSouth countries.
- Since June 29, 2009, **868 additional confirmed A(H1N1) cases** have been reported.
- Since June 29, 2009, 4 new countries have reported their first cases: **Bosnia, FYRO Macedonia, Malta, and Syria**.

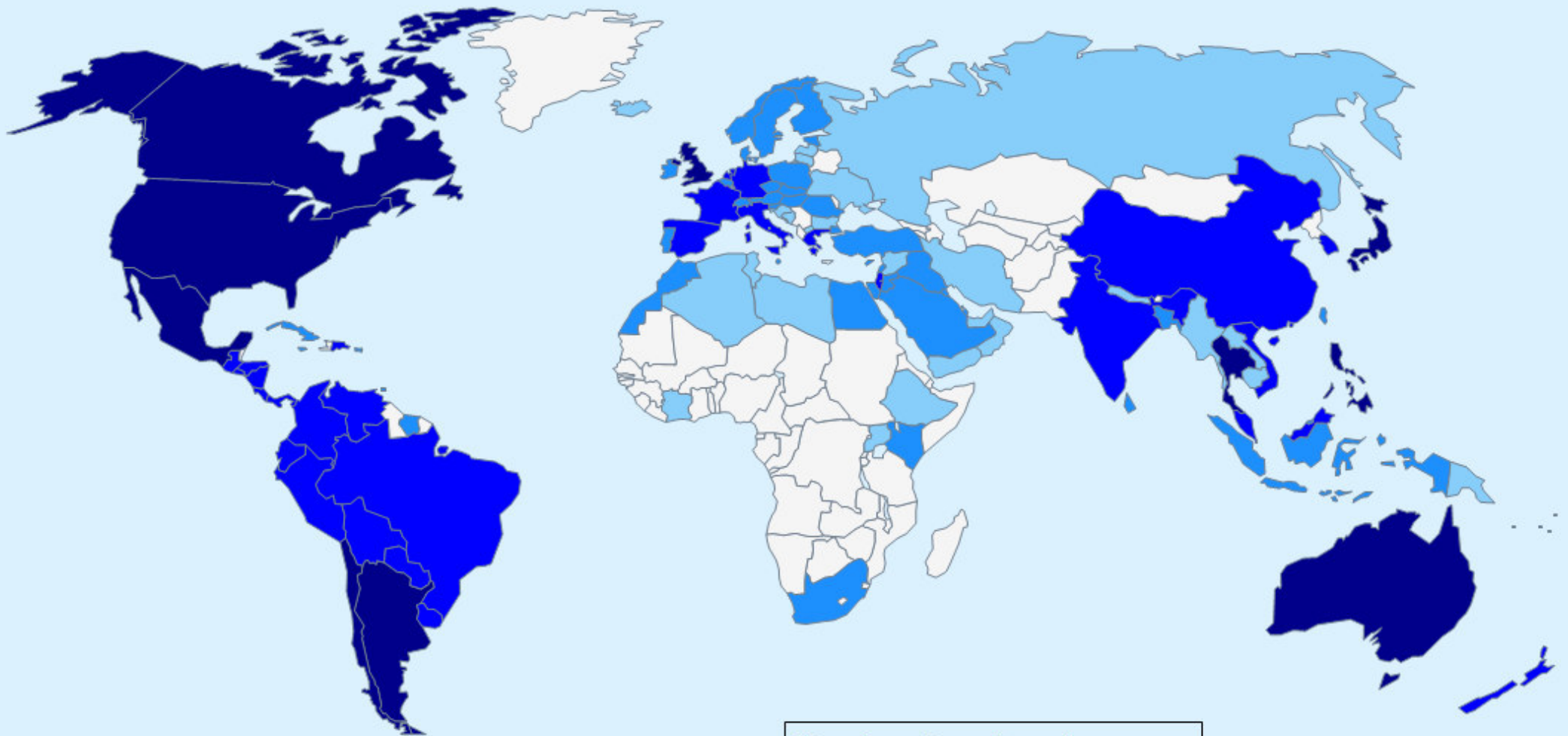
