- On 10th May 2011, the Egyptian Ministry of Health reported 1 new case of A(H5N1) human infection, in Alexandria governorate (cf. map 1).
- The case died.
- In Egypt, the last human case was reported on 14th April 2011 in Fayoum governorate ([cf. eWEB n°161](#)).
- Since the 1st case of bird flu in Egypt which occurred in 2006, the case count is 144 cases including 48 deaths.
