### Second Euromediterranean Ministerial Conference on Health Cairo 16-17 November 2008

#### > General objectives of the conference

The conference will be the opportunity to advocate for a greater importance of health dimension in the Barcelona process: Union for the Mediterranean.

The conference will aim at fostering mutual cooperation and at developing joint work programmes with a view to strengthen health systems and to ensure effective collective response to common health challenges in the Euro-Mediterranean region such as communicable and non communicable diseases.

A ministerial declaration is being discussed and will be adopted by the participants. The declaration will be the base for the development of future cooperation and projects in the region. Participants will be welcome to propose their priority fields of cooperation/projects.

#### > Themes of discussions (ministerial conference 17th)

The three main themes that will be tackled during the 2<sup>nd</sup> ministerial euromed conference on health (17<sup>th</sup> november) are:

- Strengthening of health systems
- Non communicable diseases
- Communicable diseases

These topics will be discussed by the ministers on the 17<sup>th</sup> and should constitute the backbone of the final declaration.

Considering that 43 countries are part of the Barcelona Process: Union for the Mediterranean, the speeches of the Ministers/Heads of delegations will have to be limited to 3 minutes.

#### > Workshops (High officials/experts, 16th)

#### Themes

The day before, 16<sup>th</sup>, will be dedicated to the high officials discussions on these issues. The themes have been narrowed down to, respectively:

- «Health systems and personnel in the Euromed region: a common challenge »
- «Fighting cancer in the Euromed region »
- «Controlling infectious diseases in the Euromed region »

## **EpiSouth Project Objective**

Episouth Network aims at creating a framework of collaboration on epidemiological issues in order to improve communicable diseases surveillance, communication and training across the countries in the area of Mediterranean and Balkans





## **Project history**

In occasion of the Year of the Mediterranean (2005), 6 European Public Health Institutes agreed to elaborate a framework of collaboration

In October 2006 the EpiSouth Project started with 9 European countries with a Grant Agreement with DG-Sanco

In March 2007 countries from S.Europe, Balkans, N. Africa and Middle East, together with WHO and EC met in Rome to elaborate a new partnership, thanks also to TAIEX support

In June 2007 the Italian MOH made funds available for non-EU countries participation






EU Countries at the Project starting (Oct 2006)






EU & non-EU Countries as per May 2007

## Episouth Network Added Values

- fills a geographical area with common public health problems (Balkans and Mediterranean Basin) that is not addressed, as a whole, neither by the European Commission nor by WHO
